SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

Description of First Aid Measures

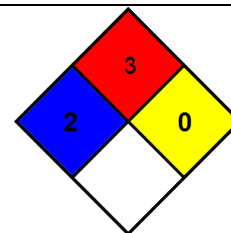
